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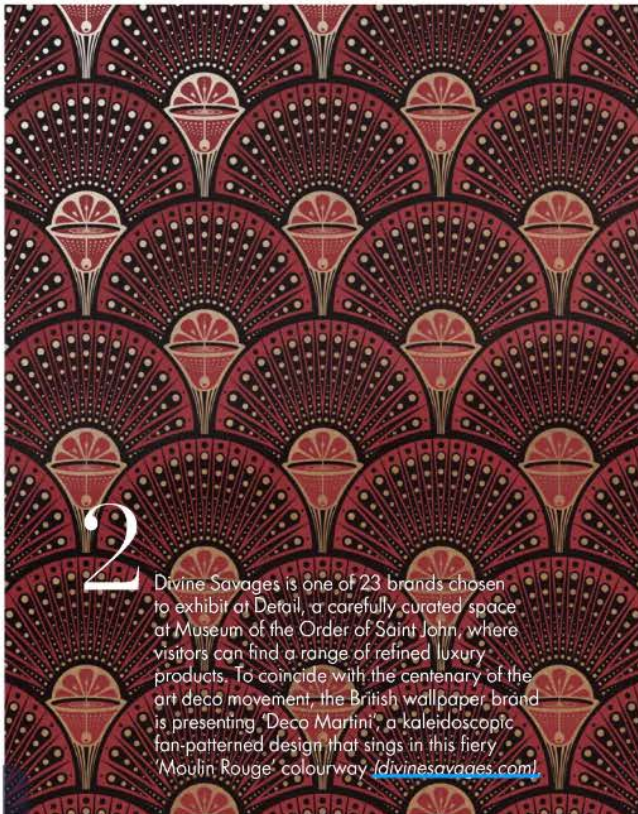


More unmissable highlights

With more than 15 venues and 160 local showrooms opening their doors, these are some of the installations, products and exhibitions to make a beeline for



L Sleep is the design industry's latest obsession. For evidence, see Laila Gohar's stripey range for Marimekko or Bolzan's collection of four bespoke headboards by Martino Gamper, India Mahdavi (design pictured), Julie Richoz and Sam Baron. First shown in Milan, this 'Chase the Sun' installation is coming to Old Sessions House for the festival. 'It is not only a poetic reference to the world of sleep, but it also reflects a deep personal belief: every day takes shape from dreams, from the desires that guide us and push us beyond limits,' says Elisabetta Bolzan, CEO of Bolzan (bolzan.com).



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Divine Savages is one of 23 brands chosen to exhibit at Detail, a carefully curated space at Museum of the Order of Saint John, where visitors can find a range of refined luxury products. To coincide with the centenary of the art deco movement, the British wallpaper brand is presenting 'Deco Martini', a kaleidoscopic fan-patterned design that sings in this fiery 'Moulin Rouge' colourway (divinesavages.com).

Brick is having a moment. 'Brick From a Stone: Arch Revival', one of two large-scale installations celebrating the humble material, will take over Clerkenwell Green. Created by Hawkins\Brown and engineered by Webb Yates, it is comprised of two four-metre-high arched pavilions: one formed from sandstone bricks from Hutton Stone's quarries, the other made from Heritage Portland Stone bricks from Albion Stone (albionstone.com) (huttonstone.co.uk).

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There is a strong Scandinavian presence at this year's festival, with Hay, String Furniture and Bolon showcasing products. Also be sure to drop by lesser-known Copenhagen-based brand Mater's showroom. It is exhibiting its sustainable 'Terra' lighting for the first time. Designed by OEO Studio, this collection of wall, pendant and portable lamps is made of recycled post-consumer e-waste and coffee-shell waste from BKI Foods (materdesign.com).
